Donations will be used to support youth and women entrepreneurial projects in Rwanda. Up to 50 percent of the Rwandan population is under the age of 20 years and only 30 percent of Rwandan businesses are owned by women. We know that when women are economically empowered, they reinvest a significant portion of their income into their families and communities, leading to broader societal benefits.

As we offer opportunities for youth to become entrepreneurs, they will create jobs, bring communities together and inspire others to be successful.

As we look forward to the future, the following recommendations were made:

- 1. Assure that the strategic plan reflects who we are and where we are. It needs to be updated to align with our current focus. The African voice needs to be included along with sustainable goals for the future of the organization. Arrange board meetings at a time that is suitable for our African partners, recognizing the 6 to 7 hour time difference.
- 2. Board revitalization: Assure that there is a membership committee that will grow membership to build organizational capacity. We must follow established practices as approved in bylaws and build a cohesive relationship with each other. We need to expand our international communications with African partners.
- 3. Finalize the book project before the March fundraiser event. The book will now be coedited by Harvey, Berhanu and Desmond.
- 4. We need to list projects that we will take on, to include membership, business and fundraising plan.
- 5. Establish a clear list of board memberships.

Isabella is the winner of the inaugural Prudential Emerging Visionaries award, the Princeton Prize in Race Relations and the Princess Diana Award. She was also selected for Teen Vogue's "21 Under 21" list of revolutionary changemakers.
